If you want to know more about the use of cookies that makes this website <https://blureffect.co/> is in the right place. Below, we will explain exactly what cookies are; what type of cookies we use and for what purpose; and how you can exercise your right to configure your browser and disallow the use of some of them.

What is a cookie?

A cookie is a file that is downloaded to your computer when you access certain websites or blogs. Cookies allow that website, among other things, to store and retrieve information about the user's browsing habits or your computer and, depending on the information they contain and the way you use your computer, can be used to recognize you.

The user's browser stores cookies on the hard disk only during the current session, occupying minimal memory space and not harming the computer. Cookies do not contain any specific personal information, and most of them are deleted from the hard drive at the end of the browser session (so-called session cookies).

Most browsers accept cookies as standard and, independently of them, allow or prevent temporary or stored cookies in the security settings.

Cookies are associated with the browser, not the person, so they do not usually store sensitive information about you, such as credit card or bank details, photographs or personal information, etc.. The data they do store are technical, statistical, personal preferences, content personalization, etc.
